Southlake Safety Fair



This past Saturday May 21st the IPSSA Fort Worth Chapter participated in the City of Southlake, TX Summer Safety Fair. Our goal was to promote backyard water safety in conjunction with IPSSA National's month of May water safety campaign to raise awareness of backyard water safety preparedness. Manning our booth were IPSSA Fort Worth chapter members Monica Morris, Amanda Hoksbergen, Rex Godbee, and Dave Boyd. The fair is sponsored by the cities' Department of Parks and Recreation and is designed to get parents and their children prepared for a safe and fun summer season. The fair ran from 10am until 1pm and during that time we handed out over 100 coloring books, crayon sets, water watched tags, and water safety brochures. 40 DVD's produced by the National Drowning Prevention Alliance (NDPA) were also handed out to parents and Grandparents. Many of those the team spoke with were grateful for the swimming safety conversations we engaged them with and were planning to view the DVD. They also said they plan to share it with other friends and relatives who care for or oversee the swimming activity of young children who have yet to be swimming certified. The organizer for the event, Mr. Paul Ward, of the City of Southlake encouraged IPSSA Fort Worth to participate in next year's event and we assured him we would definitely be there in 2012.

IPSSA CHANGES MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: MINIMUM INSURANCE COVERAGE DEFINED

At its May 14, 2011 meeting, the IPSSA Board of Regional Directors (BORD) approved policy changes regarding insurance requirements for membership.

Effective immediately, members will be required to have the following minimum insurance requirements:

- Commercial general liability insurance of \$1,000,000 coverage per occurrence
- This policy should cover the member's work, i.e. pool service/repair or pool remodeling
- The member should have his/her carrier provide a certificate of insurance to IPSSA so that IPSSA will be notified if the policy is cancelled
- The carrier shall have a rating of no less than "A" per A.M. Best Company

Current members now have the option of purchasing general liability insurance (for themselves and for their employees) from companies other than

The IPSSA Water Chemistry Certification Exam is based on IPSSA's Basic Training Manual-Part 1. We have training manuals and workbooks available so you can get yourself prepared.

The exam is offered on-line at no cost.

To take the exam on-line, write to exam@ipssa.com or call 888-360-9505 to obtain a log-in ID and password. When requesting a log-in ID and password, we will need your full name, company name, mailing address, telephone number, e-mail address, and the name of the chapter you wish to join.

You will receive your log-in ID and password no later than the next business day.

The IPSSA Water Chemistry Certification Exam contains 50 questions.

You may refer to your copy of the IPSSA Basic Training Manual-Part 1 when taking the exam, but you only have 60 minutes in which to complete it.

During the 60 minutes you can go back and change answers. You will not be able to answer any questions after your 60 minutes expire.

You must get 90% or more of the questions right in order to pass. After you have completed the exam on-line, you will be notified of the results immediately.

There are a limited number of times you can take the exam with the same log-in ID and password



ARE YOUR PRICES COMPETITIVE?

This month I'd like to discuss the topic of setting prices. First one question for you: How do you set your prices for repairs and maintenance in your business? I ask this because I frequently see pool company owners reducing their prices to ensure they get the "job."

Setting prices is nothing more than a formula. Cost of goods (pump, grids, etc), plus labor, plus gas, and replacements. All of these items are self explanatory except maybe "replacements." Replacement is a charge for replacing nets, poles, and even vehicles. This formula ensures that you make money on every job instead of wondering where all those expenses are coming from. Bottom line is the company is supposed to replace equipment used in the course of business.

To ensure that your prices are competitive, call other pool companies to inquire about their rates and services. Or if you don't want to pose as a customer you can always just ask your colleagues in the industry to get a consensus.

Welcome to the Texas Legislative Update

Monday, May 30, 2011 (140th day)

Last day of 82nd Regular Session; corrections only in house and senate
[Sec. 24(b), Art. III, Texas Constitution]

Session Ends

Sunday, June 19, 2011 (20th day following final adjournment)

Last day governor can sign or veto bills passed during the regular legislative session
[Sec. 14, Art. IV, Texas Constitution]

Monday, August 29, 2011 (91st day following final adjournment)

Date that bills without specific effective dates (that could not be effective immediately) become law
[Sec. 39, Art. III, Texas Constitution]

APEC is the only state "advocacy" association representing the interests of the pool industry in Texas. Since 2005, APEC works in conjunction with industry trade associations such as the Independent Pool and Spa Service Association ([IPSSA](#)) and the Association of Pool and Spa Professionals ([APSP](#)) to formulate positions that benefit both the industry as well as the consumer.

Government regulation, while well intended, can place an unreasonable burden on pool and spa business- often raising industry costs and increasing liability without successfully resolving the issues or protecting the consumer. With a presence at the state Capitol, APEC works with lawmakers, offering the benefit of industry knowledge and experience. We retain two lobbyists [Jake Posey](#) and [Steve Koebele](#) to execute this endeavor. Their advocacy efforts help us achieve our defining goal- to protect the welfare and bottom line of our members while maintaining an uncompromised commitment to industry safety and excellence.



APEC VICTORIOUS ONCE AGAIN!!!

APEC Members:

Steve and I are once again proud to report that APEC has achieved the passage of TWO important pieces of legislation, this time in the same day!!!

On Thursday's respective House Local **and** General Calendars was SB 1630 (commercial work authorization) and SB 710 (main drain disclosure).

The first, **SB 1630** frees all service professionals from the shackles placed upon them by the TDLR last Summer with respect to the restriction of work performed at commercial locations under a limited license. Now, those in possession of a RAI license can feel confident in the knowledge that commercial work is firmly authorized by statute. The resistance by electrical unions and other stakeholders was overcome to align interests in the bill and ensure its passage.

Next, **SB 710** provides for important disclosures to homeowners of main drains in older pools by requiring the Texas Real Estate Commission's "Standard Real Estate Disclosure Form" to contain information for the disclosure of a main drain in a pool or spa when a home is being sold.

And, while this is a very good safety measure, it is also a nice tool for business development since many APEC, IPSSA or APSP members will find themselves repairing, replacing or modifying existing pools and spas in order to ensure proper safety enhancements are made prior to the sale of a home falling under this disclosure.

Thank you for all of your support and interest throughout this session. We now will ask for Governor Rick Perry to sign each of these important bills into law.

Thank you for taking the time to read our Legislative Update Newsletter for the 82nd Legislative Session. We look forward to seeing you on a regular basis throughout the session with news and updates important to each of you!

Arrow Insurance Service, as long as the insurance meets the requirements detailed above.

Arrow Insurance Service is the endorsed provider of business liability insurance for IPSSA members. The company, founded by Ray Arouesty, has provided excellent insurance coverage specifically for IPSSA members since 1988.

Billing

Effective immediately, monthly dues invoices will detail:

- Your insurance premium (including applicable state tax)
- IPSSA chapter dues (at the amount established by your chapter)
- IPSSA Inc. dues (at the rate of \$14.50 per month)

Because all of these fees were bundled in the past, some of the insurance fees were absorbed in the IPSSA Inc. dues. The BORD approved a uniform amount of dues for all members at its May 14, 2011 meeting, which means that some members may see a small increase in their monthly statements.

Life Insurance

The life insurance policy now offered to IPSSA members is a part of the Arrow Insurance Service plan. Current (and future) members who choose general liability insurance other than the Arrow Insurance Service plan will not be provided life insurance.

Why is IPSSA Making These Changes?

The IPSSA Inc. Board of Regional Directors approved these changes in order to provide IPSSA members a choice in their business insurance decisions.

These changes also will improve the association's efforts to expand and establish a presence in other states. IPSSA currently has 95 chapters in California, Arizona, Nevada, Texas, Florida and Georgia.

These changes in no way reflect any change in support for the products and services provided to the association and its members by Arrow Insurance Service, and will enable Arrow to provide additional coverage not

available before.

What Do Members Need To Do?

Nothing!
